#### **Curriculum News**

Pupils in the lower and middle school have visited the Guildhall Museum and Kent Life for workshops based on the Bronze, Iron and Stone Age. In addition, they visited Buckmore Park Great Leaps Adventure Education and participated in bushcraft activities, map reading and orienteering, caving and archery.



Pupils have been learning about Louie Braille and Braille as a means of communication and we had a visit from Guide Dogs for the Blind where pupils learned about the working life of a guide dog and how they are trained.


#### **Curriculum News**

Mercury Class visited the National Maritime Museum and Planetarium in Greenwich.

Whilst there, pupils & staff explored the Royal Observatory which is steeped in History. We got to see some of the very first telescopes that were made by famous astrologers when they first discovered there was more in the universe than we all thought!

We then went to the Planetarium where we laid back and enjoyed a starry show. The whole theatre was in darkness and the ceiling turned into the night sky. We then had a virtual trip to the rings of Saturn, Jupiter and Pluto. Pluto is now classed as a dwarf planet, but we were still able to look on its surface.

We had a great day exploring the museum and found out lots of new facts as well as being able to talk about what we had learned in our Mission Control Unit in LMTW.



#### **Community Links**

Pupils in the upper school are engaged in two community projects. One at St. Francis Church in Strood where pupils are helping with general maintenance.



The other project is at Cliffe Pools Nature Reserve where pupils are helping to make and erect signposts for the walks around the lakes, gathering firewood ready for the large fire pit, pruning shrubberies and painting fences. Two of the students are working on a media project, gathering information about the walks and wildlife, and taking photos which, they hope to make into a calendar at the end of the year.
